

I hope you had a great summer and are looking forward to more sailing this California winter!







*The Latest Technology*

Barbara Block, scientist and marine biology researcher at Stanford University, teamed with the International Hawaiian Billfish Tournament organizers and together, developed new electronic tags that transmit information about the migratory patterns and behavior of billfish. In addition, they're collecting data concerning oxygen depletion in salt water, or hypoxia, which forces fish to migrate to a better environment.

The tag, a mini computer processor that costs \$5,000 each, is programmed to send, via satellite, the compiled data after 180 days. The cost is covered by sponsors and research grants. Anglers who catch and tag billfish will get free entry into the International Hawaiian Billfish Tournament. This truly is an example of technology helping to improve an important fishery.

Beware What You Wish For

The scene was a race sponsored by Dana West Yacht Club. The race started near Newport Pier, went around the west end of Catalina and finished in Dana Point. *Eris*, an Olson 30, was skippered by Jim Kerrigan, with a crew consisting of Mario Busard and Linus Rauls. They had a good start and popped a chute in 10 knots of wind, which quickly built to 25 knots before they got to the west end of the island. There went the plans for getting the new barbecue grill out to prepare the delicious shrimp, steak and cognac

chocolates. The crew was in foul weather gear sitting on the starboard aft rail trying to keep the bow from plunging into the water and preventing the boat from catapulting. However, being short-handed, *Eris* was soon completely out of control, dipping the spreaders in the water, laying on its side for about three seconds, then popping into a vertical position and off they went again. This event happened three times and that's when Kerrigan ordered the crew to drop the spinnaker. Linus responded, "We put it up, God takes it down." Approaching the east end of the island, the wind was so fierce they had to go beyond the jibe angle because they couldn't drop the chute. It was necessary

### OFFICIAL NOTICE TO MEMBERS

The following bylaw amendments (underlined) and deletions (strikethrough) were approved by the Board of Directors.

5.1 ANNUAL AND SEMI-ANNUAL MEETINGS: The Annual Meeting of the Members shall be held in the City of Newport Beach, California, on the most convenient day nearest the first Saturday in December of each year at such time and place as the Board of Directors shall determine. The Semi-Annual Meeting of the Members shall be held on the most convenient day nearest the last Saturday in June of each year. Notice of the Annual ~~or Semi-Annual~~ Meetings shall be mailed by the Secretary to all Members of the Club at least ten (10) days prior to said meeting.

5.3 ORDER OF BUSINESS. The order of business at the Annual and Semi-Annual Meetings shall be as specified by the Commodore and shall include the following:

1. Roll Call
2. The Reading of the Minutes
3. Reports of Officers According to Rank
4. Communications to the Secretary
5. Reports of Committees
6. Unfinished Business
7. New Business
8. Adjournment

5.6 QUORUM. Thirty-three percent (33%) of the Members in person or by proxy, qualified to vote on the matter under consideration shall, except as otherwise provided for in these Bylaws, constitute a quorum for the purpose of voting on such matter at any meeting of the Members. If, at any Annual or Semi-Annual Meeting, there shall not be a quorum, such meeting shall be adjourned by the Officer presiding to such time and place as such person may designate.
