US Sailing Certification Program

I am really excited and looking forward to 2019! This year as rear commodore, I will be attending all land-based committee meetings, providing my full support to these committees. In addition, I will continue to co-chair the Food and Beverage committee with the new co-chairs, Nancy and Mike Means.

A new project for this upcoming year, started in January, is the creation of a business plan to bring the US Sailing certification program, complete with classes and sailing lessons by certified instructors, to BCYC. I am heading up this effort and will be working closely with several key BCYC members. This is a big project involving a great deal of planning and preparation. We are estimating program launch will be no later than January, 2020. Thanks to our members' amazing support of The Gala 2017, BCYC was able to purchase a keelboat that is perfect for use with our Junior Sailing program and this boat qualifies under the requirement of the US Sailing program. I will provide regular updates as this project moves forward.

This year, it has been agreed that BCYC will host a scaleddown version of the Newport to Ensenada (N2E) pre-race party, partnering with Newport Ocean Sailing Association (NOSA). Event attendees will be strictly limited to BCYC members, race entrants and their crew, race sponsor representatives, and U.S. and Mexican dignitaries. Event coordinators will be myself and Junior Staff Commodore Jerry Shandera working closely with the NOSA representative, Staff Commodore Mary Bacon.

Port Rules, Section A. Paragraph 15: Club Burgee Required

It is mandatory that member boats in the marina fly the club burgee and that such burgee be in good condition. This requirement shall not apply to racing boats prohibited from flying a burgee. Following written notice and fifteen (15) day period to cure, the port captain shall have discretion to replace any club burgee on a member boat in the marina, which is not in good condition, and the cost of the new burgee shall be charged to the member's club account.

Boater Card

In 2018, the State of California initiated a Boater Card (boat driver's license) requirement for operators of vessels under power. During 2018, persons 20 and younger were required to take a course of instruction and pass an exam to obtain their "license." Getting caught without the license would result in a stiff fine.

For **2019**, the age limit is changed and now persons **25 and younger** operating a vessel under power are subject to the requirement (and to the fine for non-compliance).

If you or your children fit into this age category...**ACT NOW**...here's how:

STEP #1 - Apply for a Boater Card ID#. To do this:

- 1. Go to californiaboatercard.com
- 2. Select "Apply Now" on the menu and follow the directions select the fourth bullet of Step #3 (*I have not yet taken Boating Safety Education at this time*)
- 3. Pay the \$10 fee and receive an ID# which is needed to register for the course

STEP #2 – Complete a training class and take an exam. You may take the course online.

- 1. Select one of the online courses at californiaboatercard. com/courses
- 2. Be sure to select a course that is certified at least through 2019
- 3. Complete the course (it will take a few hours in front of the computer)
- 4. Take the exam at the end of the course.
- 5. Upon passing the exam, you can print a Certificate (temporary proof that you took the course and passed the exam). About two weeks later you will receive the Boater Card.

By the way, even if you are older than 25, you should take the course and the exam...and get your Boater Card. After all, safety comes before age. Do it now!

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
